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The annual Spring Festival at Boys and Girls Country is my favorite event of the year. It also marks my seven-year anniversary with this wonderful family. I met so many people on my first day that it is hard to recall everything that happened. But, I do remember a beautiful day filled with energetic activity, happy faces and the best barbecue plate on this side of Houston (by the way, the barbecue plate is still just \$8).

Since then, we have seen some significant changes on our campus: new cottages, more graduates, an increase in specialized services and a community impact that continues to grow. Five new cottages have been completed and the next two are fully funded. New construction will continue until the cottage rebuild campaign is complete. There are too many donors to thank them all here, but the Houston community has stepped up for the kids who call Boys and Girls Country their home.

Our national recognition with the Council on Accreditation (COA) is one thing that continues to separate us from our peers. This distinction was earned in 2020 and will be renewed this year. We continue to hold ourselves to rigorous oversight, financial and evidence-based standards. Our staff utilizes quantitative assessment tools, such as the CAFAS Youth Assessment—the gold standard for evaluating a youth's daily functioning—to measure the behaviors and emotional health of our children. We aim to ensure that our donors' investments consistently uphold the highest standards.

Despite our growth, our core values have not changed. Faith, education and hard work are timeless principles that we model for our children every day. Our private funding and generous donors give us the opportunity to go above and beyond to meet the needs of our kids. We have had fifty-three high school graduates in the last seven years, and our alumni continue to tell our story through their achievements and successes in various fields, demonstrating the lasting impact of our program.

While I was in graduate school in New Mexico, I specialized in serving Hispanic and Native American populations. During my time there, I learned the unique significance indigenous tribes place on certain numbers, especially the number seven. The Seventh Generation Principle is based on the idea that the decisions we make today should result in a sustainable world seven generations into the future. While my seven years at Boys and Girls Country seems like a brief moment in time, your investment in our mission will impact our children for generations to come.

TBRI CAMP

In February, we hosted our second Trust-Based Relational Intervention (TBRI®) camp for eight students, led by our Director of Trauma Competency & Implementation, Dr. Angie Proctor. These innovative camps are specifically designed to meet the needs of children who have experienced early-childhood trauma, aiming to foster meaningful connections between children and their peers. During the camp, each child was paired with a carefully selected mentor who guided them through the camp's curriculum. Together, they engaged in trust-building games and activities, helping to nurture a positive and supportive relationship through shared experiences.

For the first time, we invited parents to join our camp, focusing on enhancing the experience for both campers and their families. We are grateful to report that we had 100% attendance from all the families invited! Throughout the camp, we provided TBRI training and nurture groups to the parents and guardians, empowering them with the same skills we use to support their children daily. These trainings allow our families to implement these skills not just at camp but also at home, encouraging open communication and relationship growth. Our ultimate goal is to effect positive, lasting changes in the lives of the families we serve.

Twin Sisters Join BGC

We recently had the pleasure of welcoming two 5th-grade girls to our campus. These twin sisters have quickly captured the hearts of our staff with their infectious smiles and unwavering optimism. They perfectly embody the resilience of the children we serve and were excited to share how they have adjusted to life at BGC.

What was your first week like at BGC?

- K: There were lots of kids around, and I wasn't used to that. It was pretty loud my first week, but I like having so many friends to play with. There is always something to do.
- S: I was scared having my own room for the first time.
 I have always shared a room with my sister so it was hard learning to be on my own at night, but I'm starting to like it now.



What was it like starting a new school?

- K: I was a little scared at first, but all of the adults have been really nice and made sure I felt comfortable in my new class. I have started to make new friends and that has helped a lot.
- S: It was hard starting over because I missed my old teacher and friends, but I'm starting to adjust and it's not so bad.

What is your favorite thing about BGC?

- K: We are on the same team for softball, and it is both of our first times playing it so I'm excited to get to do that with my sister. I think I'm going to try and play as many sports as possible.
- S: There is so much to do!

Have you learned anything new since being at BGC?

- K: I have learned that it's OK to be scared and that adults are there to help you. I have also learned that we can do hard things.
- S: I have learned that sometimes you need someone to talk to and that it's OK to ask for help.

What would you say to a kid who might be coming to live at BGC?

- K: I would let them know that it can be fun because you can try new things that you have never done before, and there will always be someone your age to hang out with.
- S: I would tell them that it might be scary at first, but there is always someone to talk to and you don't ever have to feel alone.

What do you want to be when you grow up?

- K: I want to be a nurse or firefighter because they get to help people who need it.
- S: I want to be an architect because I want to make sure that everyone who wants a home can have one.
