We had another epic year at Boys and Girls Country of Houston! As you read our impact report for 2025, there is one statement that comes to my mind: Mission Accomplished!

Our program is no longer a secret. For many years it seemed as if we were a small ministry tucked away in the sticks of northwest Houston - that is no longer the case with the significant growth in our community. Over the last several years, we have been featured in local media, hosted a record number of visitors to tour our campus, and interns from several top tier universities have worked with us every summer. Our students on campus continue to thrive every year with high school seniors entering our highly successful college and career program.

Our campus continues to see the construction of new cottages, providing a spacious and secure home for children. This past year the Royce and Melba Roberts Cottages were completed and opened for up to 16 children, and this year the Sorensen Cottage will be completed and will serve up to 8 more children. The blessings continue to abound for Boys and Girls Country, and we are grateful for your support.

Over the past couple of years, we have had several discussions with our executive committee and stakeholders on the future of Boys and Girls Country. We have seen major legislative changes on the state and federal levels. The best way to summarize the new legal requirement is that children in residential care must live in an accredited, top-quality program! Of course, this is already who we are. Regretfully, many programs have had to close their doors over the past two years, but we can assure you that we are not going anywhere. In fact, the future is brighter than ever for our mission!

As we begin 2026, the question we want to answer is: What Can We Become? In other words, how can we evolve into an industry innovator? Currently, we train over 500 teachers and counselors every year. Several school districts have utilized the training of our experts with children from traumatic backgrounds. But, can we still do more to serve our community? Our kids are now in new cottages, and some of the "older" cottages have not been torn down. This year we will pilot a single mother's program in two of the older cottages. The children of these mothers will be school-age and receive the same services as all the other kids on campus - counseling, tutoring, clothing, mentorship, and spiritual formation. We will use our expertise in family systems to advance our mission.

What can Boys and Girls Country become in 2026? The words of the prophet Isaiah speak to the future of our ministry: "Behold, I am doing a new thing; now it springs forth, do you not perceive it? I will make a way in the wilderness and rivers in the desert" (Isaiah 43:19). This verse speaks to God's promises of new paths and provision even in impossible situations. Next year's Impact Report will be filled with the new things God is doing at Boys and Girls Country!
